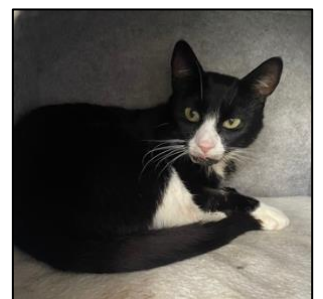
June and her late husband Ian (Cat Daddy) started the GCH rescue 17 years ago, and she has been rescuing and rehoming cats and kittens in need ever since. June has a dedicated team of volunteers, amazing [website](#), [Facebook](#), and [Insta](#) pages, some wonderful foster parents, and superb support from [Voo Vets](#). Starting with two cats, June now has 21 permanent rescue residents, as well as 11 cats of her own, and 10 in long-term foster care. In 2024, there were 64 cats and 95 kittens adopted, a total of 159. This year so far, there have been 43 cats and 45 kittens/ juniors adopted. The rescue work is 24/7 and it thrives thanks to June's commitment, expertise, and care, along with fantastic support from dedicated volunteers and amazing followers. Thanks to June and all of you, GCH really is a very special place: a cat sanctuary.



Chess was found injured on 17 August by a lady who had been feeding him in her garden. He had a terrible injury whereby the skin had been ripped from his jaw (degloving). Steve went to rescue him, and we rushed him straight to Voo. A CT scan showed a skull fracture, a jaw fracture, a cracked eye socket, soft tissue damage around his chin, and damage to his nasal cavities. This may be the result of an RTA but more likely an animal attack. The staff at Voo already love Chess as he is the most affectionate cat, and he responded very well to initial treatment.



Chess has now had one lot of surgery to rewire his jaw, which thus far has been successful. He may need a further skin graft for his chin degloving. It remains to be seen if his skull and eye fractures heal on their own. With his stay in intensive care and his surgery, Chess's vet bill is already over £8000, so we shall be fundraising for him. Supporters have already generously donated over £5000. This is not a dissimilar case to that of Nelson two years ago, so we know that Chess is in the right place with us and under the care of Voo. He is only a young cat (maybe 2 years old), so there is a good chance he will recover well. Chess came home to us on 25 August and, so far, he is doing brilliantly



and his jaw is healing well; he is eating like a horse!



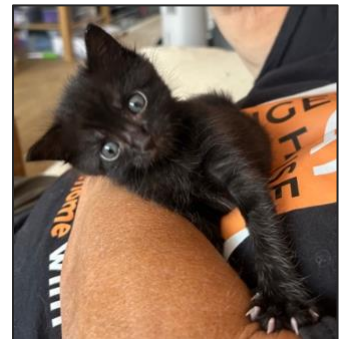
Echo was found in the middle of the road in early August; she had only been born that day. Having been taken to a vet, Samantha, a vet nurse took her home for 48 hours and then brought her to us. She was hand-reared by June & Lee from day 1, firstly every 2 hours, and then every 3.5 to 4 hours. Echo's weight rose from 0.1k up 0.45kg. She was a very active and easy hand-rear, who loved her formula milk and a cuddle. Her eyes began to open, though they were initially stuck and had to be bathed open. She loved to wriggle and have her tummy tickled, whirling her legs like a windmill when she was happy.



Echo graduated from her baby pen to a bigger one, and she started to use her litter tray and to poop on her own. We were so happy that our little star was growing up! Samantha came to visit and was delighted with her progress. Then a week ago, Echo went the vets for a check-up because she had a slight temperature, sneezed a couple of times and she was not eating so well. She was too small to take a full set of bloods, but she stayed at the vets for three days so they could monitor her temperature and treat her for infection. We were all praying for a speedy recovery for our adorable little girl.



Echo came home on 24 August, but June knew straight away that something was wrong. She seemed to be in pain, and she was breathing hard. Lee rushed her back to hospital within an hour and they took a chest x-ray which showed a problem. She had lost weight and had fluid on her lungs. She was also not eating. We prepared ourselves for the worst, and the next morning at 7.40am, Echo passed away. She may have had a congenital heart issue or a diaphragmatic hernia; we shall never know. Her sudden decline has left both us and the vets devastated, as we all were so full of hope for her, but Nature has taken her home. She was so loved in the short time she was with us, and she captured all our hearts. RIP, sweet Echo. Fly high.



Hooray for Hollis



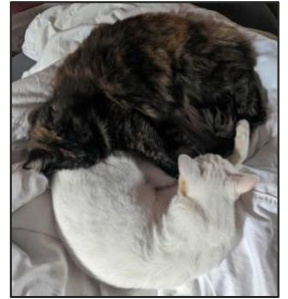
Hollis & his sister Jovie [2] were found by a dog-walker, trapped in a dumped carrier at Ravens Ait last November. We had their adoption as a pair in place, but then we found that Hollis was unwell with polyps in his ear. He went into long-term foster care with Rachel, while we sorted out his health issues. Poor Hollis couldn't hear properly, and was miserable with infections, but he flourished under the one-to-one care



of Rachel and her sister Jenna. At first, we were looking at laser surgery for his ears, but it was not available, so we opted for ear canal drainage.



Hollis had his surgery in May to open his ears in order to get better drainage from the polyps. His surgeons created a drain hole and took out as many polyps as they could, while widening the ear canals, to prevent further infections. He returned to Rachel & Jenna for three months' recuperation, and his treatment of daily ear drops and steroids. He responded brilliantly to his treatment. Thankfully his adopters still keen to have him, and Hollis was reunited with his sister Jovie this month. We are delighted that they seem to have re-bonded very quickly. There is no guarantee that his chronic condition won't return, but we are hoping for the best for this adorable little boy. It is so lovely to have such a happy ending for this lovely pair of cats. Huge thanks to the incredible care given by Rachel & Jenna to get Hollis well – we love a happy ending!



Rescue Babies



Havana [2] came in to us pregnant on 3 August, having been found outside a block of flats. Her babies were born 48 hours later. She gave birth to 4 ginger kittens, two boys and two girls: **Paulo, Reno, Capri & Dominica**, now three weeks old. Havana has a strange habit whereby she wants to lay her kittens on a hard surface, not a blanket or the cat cave. She likes them to place them on a hard floor! It is an ongoing battle of wills between us! That said, mum & babies are all thriving - she is a very good mum.

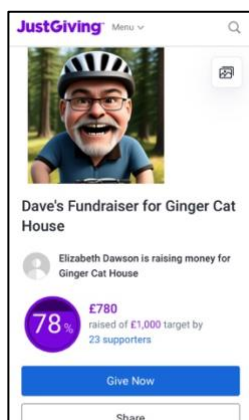

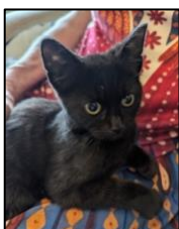


London to Brighton bike ride

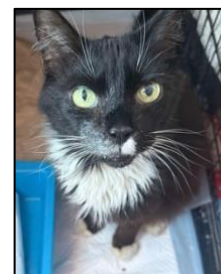


Other recent arrivals



Sprite [8-9wks]: was found under a car and came in this week. She was riddled with fleas and very quiet. Lee bathed and combed her straight away. Young kittens can become anaemic very fast, and they can even die with so many fleas. Our flea treatment has worked well; she is a bit brighter. Sprite's initial vet check showed that she has severe flea anaemia, which will take a week or so to recover from. She has been tucking into her biscuits and is recovering well.

Gaston [10]: was found in the East End of London on 23 August, looking emaciated. The finder had been feeding 'Jilly' for a couple of weeks and was very concerned, she suspected the owner may have died. We appealed for a fosterer, and Salina volunteered to help. The founder drove 'Jilly' to us, and at this point we realised 'Jilly' was in fact Gaston! Salina has already given him a 'spa day' and he has been to the vets for his initial check and bloods.



Tacos & Carnita [4mo]: were found in a garden mid-August, and they have just gone into foster with Jenny, who loves them. They are a very sweet, bonded pair of siblings, who love to chase each other and play fight. They are doing brilliantly, and they are beginning to come out of their shells. They have a viewing this week.

Rhiannon [3]: was brought in at the beginning of August by someone who said they had found her in the street. She was raging, traumatised, and very scared but she quickly calmed down and became very affectionate and vocal, though she still has her moments! Unfortunately, she also has several health issues (see Holby Kitty).

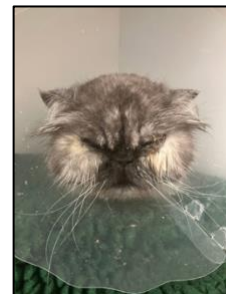
Our main expense, as a rescue, is our vet bills. In the financial year 2024-2025, we spent more than £200,000. We have so many cats and kittens through our doors that, inevitably, from time to time we come across some serious and unusual health issues. We are fortunate to have access to excellent surgeons at [Voo Vets](#) and generous supporters, who help out when we need extra financial assistance for such unexpected and difficult circumstances. Below are some of the cats and kittens who have needed medical help this quarter.



Gaston [10]: At his first vet check, Gaston had a full set of bloods. His pupils are unevenly dilated, he has soft tissue masses on right rib cage and a heart murmur, a few missing teeth, and he is very thin. He is very hungry from his time on the streets. His first set of tests showed a high white cell count which shows an infection, but he is not hyperthyroid, which is good news. He is undergoing more tests because of his low weight and his pupils. **Smidge**

[16]: had an ulcer in his eye, which wouldn't heal despite 3 hourly eye drops.

It transpired that he needed a corneal graft, preceded by a heart scan before surgery because of his heart arrhythmia. His eye lid was stapled together after surgery. The graft then needed extra trimming, and an intensive eye drop regime. After 10 days, the staples were removed. The graft was successful, but an abscess had since developed behind Smidge's eye. With further intensive eye drops, the abscess seems to be improving, but we are not sure at this stage if he will keep his eye. He is pretty fed up with being penned and wearing a cone, but he is being very brave. He gets regular fresh roast chicken after his eye drops, for being so good!



Enya & Orla [10mo]: were thrown over a wall in a carrier with their sibling **Fia** in early July; all



three had calicivirus and mycoplasma. Enya was heavily pregnant and gave birth prematurely to 4 kittens, who all sadly died. Then, she herself went into hospital with a uterus infection for 5-6 days; she has since recovered. Enya has just had her spay and is doing well back at the rescue. Medically, she is much better, and she is growing in confidence after her trauma. Orla also had a facial swelling from impact of being thrown over fence, but fortunately the swelling has



gone down. All three girls have now been spayed. **Bruno [2]:** still has a bad tummy from his coronavirus, which he has not yet shaken off, but he is well in himself. Recently, he had faecal samples taken, which showed that he also has giardia. He is quarantined, while he is being treated with antibiotics. He is taking his quarantine very well.





Rio [10mo] Following his recent fits, Rio had a CT scan and a spinal tap costing £3000. He had a flare-up of calicivirus and has ongoing autoimmune polyarthritis, but the spinal tap showed nothing conclusive. He has had two more fits since then, one of which was quite severe. Now, Rio is on Atopica and steroids, for his autoimmune conditions. He was also sore and depressed, but his painkillers mean he is now a lot brighter. This will be an ongoing condition for Rio. He is a poorly but lovely, wonky cat. **Tarik [2]:** came to us having been found in a garden for 4 weeks. He was severely matted, very thin, depressed and lethargic, not neutered or chipped. Tests showed he had a coronavirus and salmonella, which have been treated with antibiotics, and he transformed from a matted, ill cat into a beautiful Persian boy. who has just been adopted. We all miss him greatly, but he has lovely new home, which he is thoroughly enjoying.



Tigra [3]: When her kittens were two days old, Tigra's breathing was very laboured and she was mouth-panting. She went into hospital with her babies for two days. Tests have showed mycoplasma, which was treated with antibiotics, and she was able to keep feeding her babies throughout. She is now a lot better, but her breathing is not yet back to normal, she is a lot calmer in herself though. **Lizzie [13]:** recently has had a bad tummy. Tests showed that she has tritrichomonas, a parasitic tummy bug. She is on a 14 day course of antibiotics, due to finish on 26 August. She is missing sitting on people's laps, but she has been very good about being quarantined in a pen. Jackie has been giving her regular baths to keep her comfortable; we'll be giving her a nice groom so she can get back to her usual pretty self.

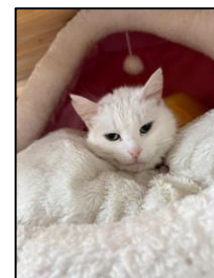


Rhiannon [3]: went into vet because she had become very hoarse with her frequent calling; we suspected laryngitis. However, tests have shown that she has pre-cancerous cells in her larynx, so we are going to wait and see before starting any sort of chemotherapy. She is under close observation, as she is very skinny. Rhiannon has just been spayed, so she is much quieter, but she is not a well little lady, so she is recuperating in Kitty Haven. **Henna [18mo]:** was not putting on as much weight as we would like after her babies were born in May, so she had bloods done. This was followed by an endoscopy which showed thickening of intestines. Fortunately, this appears to be IBD and not FIP. Henna is also very low in B12, so she has a six weeks' course of injections which are ongoing. We are waiting to spay Henna and then she will be ready for adoption.

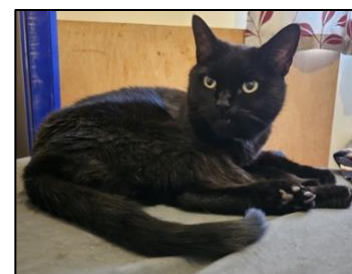




Benny [12]: had a check-up scan for his heart condition, which showed that his heart is 'smoking', so some blood is leaking. He is on a cocktail of essential drugs, but he is feisty about taking them. At the moment he is doing ok, but he needs to take his medication in order to stay well. Benny is now very fussy and fickle about cat food, preferring human options such as chicken, steak and prawns! This week, Benny also received a small cut to his head, but because of his blood-thinning medication, he began to bleed profusely. Lee rushed him to Voo and they used surgical glue on the cut to sort it out! His wound seems to be healing well. **Millie [13]:** has had 4 teeth out, then we were worried about her blood pressure, but it seems to be ok. Her cancer recovery is going well, but she is still weeing regularly on June's bed, she particularly likes clean sheets!



Nelson [7+]: Despite doing so well after his surgeries last year, Nelson's jaw has crumbled. He has had a CT scan to assess the damage and to see if Voo could make a 3D implant to replace his jaw. Nelson still might need this complex surgery, but the vets are worried about his high risk of infection, so he is currently under constant observation to see if he can manage without it for the time being. Nelson seems fine in himself so, as long as it is not affecting him, his surgery is on hold until it becomes essential. **Minx [10]:** our gorgeous girl, in foster with Steve, had to have couple of teeth removed, including a broken canine. She has recovered well and has just been adopted.

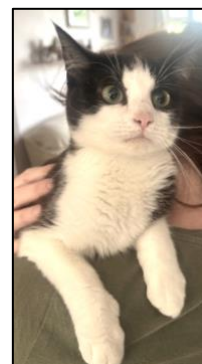
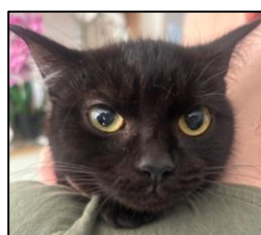


Kittens Galore!

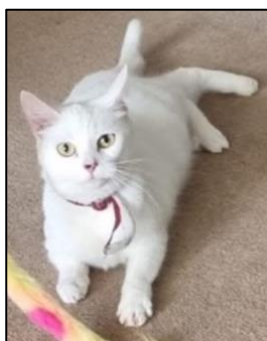

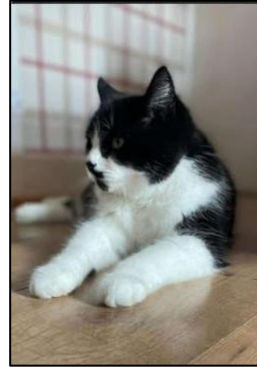

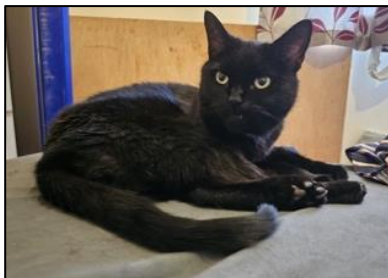

RIP



Guy [11] came into us in the end of October in very poor condition with raised liver enzymes and bad teeth. An ultrasound and full liver biopsy showed he had auto-immune hepatitis and pancreatitis. He had an injectable steroid to help his liver for a while, but we stopped those when they raised his glucose levels. He remained on liver meds and eating Bozita, which he liked. He was doing quite well, but he was always a delicate boy who liked to stay in his cat cave and needed a lot of TLC.



A couple of months ago, Guy developed diabetes and his liver values showed that his liver was failing. Essentially, he was on palliative care while we assessed his quality of life. We gave him the run of Kitty Haven, which he seemed to like but he still hid himself away a lot. We gave him insulin to treat his diabetes, but it wasn't successful because of all his other health conditions. Ultimately, Guy became wobbly and stopped eating, so we made the sad decision to put him to sleep. His finder sent us a lovely message to thank us for caring for Guy for the last 9 months. RIP, sweet boy.

"June, you have done the right thing. It's heartbreaking Guy's gone, but you've done more than anyone else would have. Since late October he's been safe, and warm and most importantly loved by you and your team. I've had cats on and off since I was 11, I've never known a cat to be so terrified of everything as Guy was. Of course, there are 'what ifs'. What if he'd arrived at mine a year earlier. What if I hadn't been let down by 2 other rescues. What if I'd contacted you first. But I think he was so ill, that and he'd been so abused that it wouldn't have mattered. He's had 9 months of warmth, safety, and love. Anyone else would have just PTS straight away. You cared and helped Guy, I will always be forever grateful. Xx"

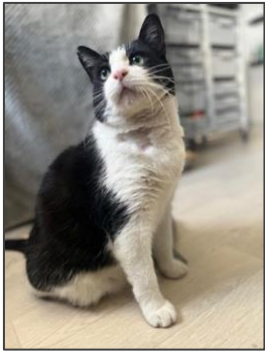
Sponsorship

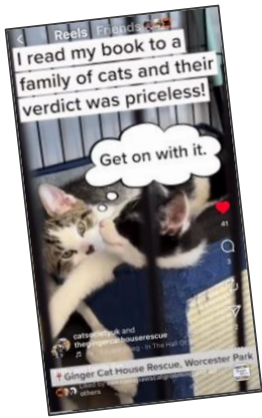
Car Booting

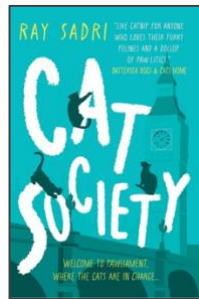


Fundraising & Support

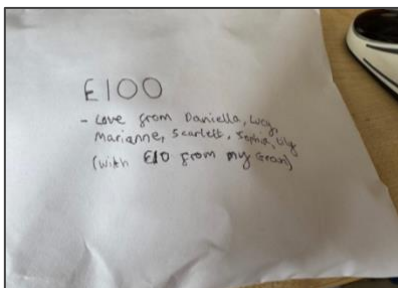

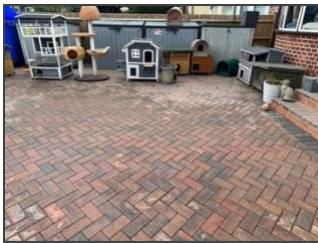

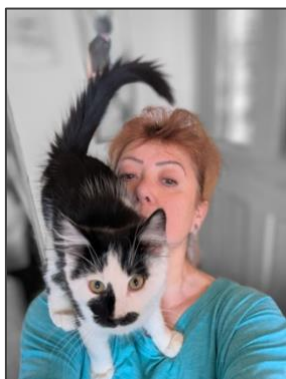
