Quarterly Newsletter August 2024

June and her late husband Ian (Cat Daddy) started the GCH rescue 16 years ago, and she has been rescuing and rehoming cats and kittens in need ever since. June has a dedicated team of volunteers, amazing website, Facebook, Twitter and Insta pages, some wonderful foster parents, and superb support from Voo Vets. Starting with two cats, June now has 15 permanent rescue residents, as well as 10 cats of her own, and 9 in long-term foster care. In 2023, there were 90 cat adoptions and 110 kittens adopted, a total of 200. This year so far there have been 48 cats and 72 kittens adopted. The rescue work is 24/7 and it thrives thanks to June's commitment, expertise, and care, along with fantastic support from volunteers and amazing followers. Thanks to June and all of you, GCH really is a very special place: a cat sanctuary.

Nelson



Our lovely boy, Nelson [5ish] came to us on 30 April very badly injured with a broken jaw, fractured palate and ruptured left eye. He went straight into intensive care and had surgery as soon as the vets thought he was strong enough. Though the surgery was successfully completed, Nelson died briefly on the operating table and had to be resuscitated by the surgeon, Pierre. He first came home to us on 13 May but was incredibly frail and was losing an alarming amount of weight (down to 1.7 kg), so he went back



into hospital. Our vets thought he might have rare autoimmune-related anemia (IMHA), but he responded well to steroids and has come through that.



Nelson had more surgery at the beginning of June as his palate wasn't healing as well as we hoped and then he contracted bronchial pneumonia. It was touch and go there for a while, but somehow Nelson pulled through. Our healer Erica was visiting him hospital and we were delighted when he was finally able to come home to the rescue. Although it will still be a long road to recovery, Nelson is a fighter, and he is now on the mend. The vets and nurses all fell in love with him. His vet bills so far have been in excess of £17,500 but, thanks to our wonderful supporters, we have been able to cover them.





Nelson is now making amazing progress, eating his favourite food (Hills AD) with a homeopathic immune supplement in his special raised bowl, and he has just started eating dry food too. Recently Nelson had some infection in his nose, which was being treated with steroids, nasal spray & flushes, and antibiotics. Nelson's weight has gone up from 1.7 to 3.26 kilos and his nose is now mostly clear. He was recently microchipped and has also just been neutered. His recovery is not far short of miraculous!











The most amazing thing is that Nelson is now behaving like a 'proper cat' – he purrs, grooms himself, miaows for food and strokes, and even sulks when he doesn't get attention! His ears are up and no longer floppy and his coat is glossy – it is such a joy to see! Nelson's godfather lan came to see him recently and was delighted with his improvement. Guests at our Cat Cafés have been able to view him from a distance and everyone has remarked on how well he now looks.











Nelson even has his own watercolour prints and a t-shirt! He also recently came 3rd in a worldwide competition, but he is always a winner in our eyes. He really is the most amazing cat with the strongest will to live we have ever seen. He has captured all of our hearts.





Biscuit Litter



The Biscuit litter, Biscotti, Florentine & Rosetta, were brought to us on Monday 20 May, when they were only 10 days old. They were found in a shed and, tragically, their mum had been found dead in the garden nearby. June began hand-rearing them as soon as they came in. At first, they were being bottle-fed with kitten formula every three hours. They are now 14 weeks old and still enjoy their bottles. It has taken them longer than usual to wean as they only had

a very short time with their mum.

On 19 June, Biscotti became a little floppy and was running temperature, we took him to the vet, and he tested positive for coronavirus and clostridium (the latter was treated with antibiotics). His temperature came down quickly and he has now completely recovered, though he is still a mummy's boy!





In early August, Florentine & Rosetta seemed under the weather, and they tested positive for herpes and mycoplasma. They are both still on antibiotics and antivirals but are on their way to recovery. Rosetta has been panting recently when allowed out of the pen, so we sent her for an x-ray in case it was anything to do with her heart, but it may just be irritated airways. Hopefully they can all soon be vaccinated, so that we can start looking for forever homes for all of them.



Biscotti is a love bug, but he is also a big baby who won't give up his bottle! His two siblings are far more independent, but at least they are no longer being bettle fed through the night. Florentine was the samllest to start with but she is also the most purry. All of them are now over 1.5 kilos and doing brilliantly.







Diddlys



On Thursday 25 July, the Diddlys, Jeremy, Lisa & Kaleb were taken to a vet after their mum was killed in an RTA; they were only 3 weeks old but, thankfully, they had a little bit of time with their mum, even though it was tragically cut short. After they came in to us, June hand-reared them for a further 3 weeks, but now they have stopped taking milk, and are tucking in to solids. In many ways they are similar to the Biscitti litter but they are far more independent! Jeremy still likes a bottle, he's another big baby (like Biscotti), Lisa is a little minx (like Florentine), and Kaleb is the 'middle child' (like Rosetta). Now 8 weeks old, Caleb was admitted with a tummy infection recently and now Lisa has been in with a bad eye, so we are keeping a close eye on them.








GCH Sky Dive

New arrivals in the last few weeks:



Ritchie came to us because his new owner's mother unexpectedly had a severe phobia of kittens, so they only kept him for 5 days. Ritchie is 9 weeks old and has integrated beautifully with the Hooligans downstairs. He has been a big hit at Cat Cafés, but we have found him a lovely home.

Hudson & Murray had been bought home by a teenager, whose mum did not want cats! They are a gorgeous pair who are now 5 months old. They have just been chipped and neutered and have now gone to their forever home.





Reggie was sat on by his family dog and he had surgery on his back leg before he came to us. He is now perfectly healthy, and we put him into Kitty Haven to assess him. He was timid at first, but he is now coming out of himself. He is 18 weeks old so not yet big enough to neuter, but we already have found a home for him. .

Khaleesi was found by side of dual carriageway near Heathrow. She is a beautiful Scottish Fold, whom we estimate is about 2 years old. She was very traumatised by her experience and was timid at first, but she is slowly gaining confidence. We'll find the right special home for her.





Denby came to us after his owner decided he didn't want him anymore and put him outside. He is 5 months old, and a gorgeous dilute golden tabby. Denby is getting accustomed to being in a pen and has just been neutered. What a beautiful boy he is! We are now looking for the right home for him.

Rio was surrendered as his elderly owner found herself unable to care for him properly. He is 7 months old and already neutered.

Our main expense, as a rescue, is our vet bills. Last year we spent in excess of £140,000. We have so many cats and kittens through our doors that, inevitably, from time to time we come across some serious and unusual health issues. We are fortunate to have access to excellent surgeons at Voo Vets and generous supporters, who help out when we need extra financial assistance for such unexpected and difficult circumstances. 
Caleb [8wks] seemed to be doing perfectly well but them became unexpectedly quiet, so we took him into the vet, and he was admitted with potential stomach issues. An x-ray showed that he may have had a bowel infection, but he is now recovering well at home. His sister Lisa has been admitted to hospital with a swollen eye, she is having intensive eye drops every hour, so we are keeping a close eye on her, but she is full of beans!




Rosetta [14 wks] had been doing really well, but when we allowed her out of her



pen for the first time, we noticed that she was panting, which was a worry, so we took her to the vets who recommended an x-ray so we could see if there was anything wrong with her heart. The results showed that her airways are irritated but no sign of heart trouble.









Lollipop [12 wks] had a swollen eye and she was diagnosed with herpes. She went to hospital for 2 days, and was given antibiotics, famciclovir and eye drops. When she came home, unfortunately the mediation did not have the desired affect and Lolly

has developed pneumonia. We had her readmitted to hospital so she could have round-the-clock care, and we sent Liquorice with her for company. She was having blood plasma eye drops, Vetimmune and L-Lysine. Lolly is now home recovering on a lot of medication. Khan [16] had pancreatitis, from which he has now recovered but we have

to keep an eye out for any flare-ups. He also had runny eyes, so the vets did a swab to check, and he had Mycoplasma, which has also been treated. Khan is currently in foster care with Linda, and he is doing really well. He is eating like a horse and needs a dental, which is planned for September. We are looking for a retirement home for this lovely old boy.





Bruno [6 mo] had to have a 're-plumbing' operation (similar to our long-term foster cat Memma), so he could wee and poop properly. The operation was

successful, and he is now toileting properly, eating well, putting on weight, and bouncing around! Bruno may need further surgery when he gets older but hopefully not. He had his stitches removed at the beginning of July and is now out of his pen and loving life. He still has some slight leakage when he leaps around but, overall, his progress is

really good. He will have more vet checks on his anal glands and, hopefully, he can be neutered soon. Marty [9] has bad teeth due to a genetic weakness. He recently had to have 10 teeth removed, and since then, he has felt much better and is far more good-tempered!



Elvis [12] has had some amazing news: his diabetes is in remission!! At first, he loved his Untamed and Bozita food, but now he prefers Thrive. His special diet has been keeping his curves steady, and he is now doing really well. Elvis' sensors have been removed and he is having checks every 2 months. The only issue now is his weight, which is over 7kg! Our next project is to put him on a diet, which he won't like, but it

is the best thing for his health. He loves running around playing cat football so we shall be encouraging more playtime and less lolling around! Calli [16+] is still on blood pressure and heart medication, and she is doing well. She had inflamed gums and gunky eyes

recently so, once her potassium levels were normal, she had 3 teeth removed. Since then, Calli has been much better. Her re-check showed that her gums are healing well, but she still has some discharge in her eyes, which needs some lubrication. We shall re-do Calli's bloods at the end of August to



check her potassium and kidney levels again. Natasha is keeping a close eye on her.



Hawkeye [1] has had surgery to rebuild his front right shoulder, which had a joint deformity from his breech birth. He now has a plate and 12 screws, following on from his bone graft. He was put on 3 months' pen rest with no climbing, and he had to be separated from his brother, Hopper. The surgery was successful, and the vets were very happy with his 6 week post-op x-rays.

Now, Hawkeye is allowed some more restricted pottering around and some supervised movement at home with Lee. His next x-rays will be at the 12 week mark in early

September. He is full of beans, and good about being penned but he does leap around in there! Memma [3] has had a successful operation in terms of reducing the amount of kidney infection, because her internal plumbing has been rerouted, but it hasn't solved all of her issues. She doesn't have full bladder control, so she has leakage issues and some of it may be behavioural. A recent urine sample showed little evidence of inflammation or infection, but her diluted urine leads to leakages and overflow. She is not recommended any



more antibiotics at the moment, but Julie is keeping a close eye on her to notify us of any changes. She is also loving her new catio!



Kentucky [6] is our long-term foster cat, who was an RTA cat with bladder and bowel damage from fractures in his pelvis when he came to us in April 2021. He

currently lives with foster mum Louise. Further to his endoscopy, he is on steroids which has improved his diarrhoea, but there are some ongoing bladder issues which we are working on with the vets. We are looking at CatEase calming supplement to help with his anxiety. Eevee [3] is our deaf cat, currently in foster with Majella. When she went in for her spay, they unexpectedly found that she has heart problems. She was put on heart drugs following her first ECG scan and had a second



scan at the end of June. Eevee's arrythmia was resolved with new medication, and she has now been neutered. She is a lovely, sweet girl and Majella adores her. She is now up for adoption.



Waffles [1] came to us with a suspected blocked bladder, but tests showed that he actually had stress-related cystitis. He was put on antibiotics, Hypovase and a special diet. While he was not keen on taking lots of medication, it worked! He started having time out from his pen, and he loved to loll on the cat tree by the window in Kitty Palace. His latest urine test was also clear. Waffles, however, remains a very picky eater! His cystitis is now under control, his eating is better, and he has begun to put on weight. We have sent him out to foster with Dee & Andy and he has blossomed there. His favourite food is N&D Herring & Orange, but he has just started

to enjoy white fish. Flash Harry [1] had a shattered pelvis and a dislocated hip from an RTA. He has since had successful surgery and was discharged at the beginning of July on 8 weeks pen rest and loads of meds. Unfortunately, his wound then broke open and had to be re-sealed. He needed twice weekly cleaning and re-bandaging for a bit. All his staples are now removed, he has more movement, and he is doing really well. Flash is allowed out of his pen for brief periods, and he is now up for adoption. He is a gorgeous boy.






The Washing Machine litter [6mo] were found in a flat, hiding in the washing machine with their mum, Lenor. Daz, Omo, Skip & Persil all had coronavirus, so we gave them L-lysine to boost their immune systems, along with good food and probiotics, while we waited for it to burn out. They all recovered quickly and fully in the care of foster mum Wendy, and they have now all been adopted.



Shelby [11mo] became ill with Bordetella, and he had upper respiratory issues. He went into hospital for tests and then went into isolation in Kitty Haven, which he wasn't very happy about at first! He has now reintegrated with the Hooligans downstairs, and he is much improved. He will have more bloods a couple of weeks, just to make sure he is all clear. Then we can start to look for a home for him. Stewie [4mo] came in with a man-made hernia (from a kick), a ruptured bowel and bladder, pelvic fractures and fractured

enough and super-surgeon Pierre repaired his damaged organs and stitched the hernia. The fractures will hopefully heal in their own time. Stewie was put on strict pen rest for 4 weeks, with no climbing, but he didn't read the memo! His 4-week check-up was good, and he is now allowed out for short periods for supervised excursions, but he is not supposed to jump for 3 months. Stewie has been a little trooper after the horrendous

trauma he has been through. We hope to be able to introduce him to the others soon.





Benny [9] was admitted to hospital with rapid breathing and they found fluid on his lungs. A CT scan has found he has an enlarged heart and swollen lymph nodes, he is scheduled for an ultrasound this week. He may have heart failure or lymphoma. We will find out soon, but we are very worried. Lollipop [12 weeks] has herpes, and though she was admitted to hospital with a swollen eye, she developed pneumonia. She is now home and recovering with loads of medication, but she is still very delicate. Lisa [8weeks] was also admitted to hospital with a swollen eye. She is having intensive care with eye drops every hour so is staying in. We hope that she be clear of it soon, as she is eating and is full of beans.
